Disclosure Scheme for Domestic Abuse Scotland - DSDAS

The scheme allows individuals to ask Police Scotland if their partner has a known history of domestic abuse towards previous partners. It also allows concerned relatives and friends to ask about someone's partner in relation to known history of domestic abuse. This is the Right to Ask. The scheme also gives Police Scotland the Power to Tell people

that they may be at risk of domestic abuse, even if the information has not been asked for.

Court mandated and multi-agency responses for victims and perpetrators of abuse

This is a court ordered service which provides an integrated approach to address men's domestic abuse and to improve the lives of women, children and men. The men's service is a structured programme for men who are convicted of domestic abuse. The women and children's services are voluntary if they wish to engage. The women's service provides safety planning and advice and emotional support to female partners and ex partners. The children's service addresses the needs of children involved, working with partner services.
